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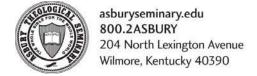

Dear Colleagues:

Yes, 12 months have flown by and it is time to begin working on budgets for the next fiscal year.

During the 1996 budget year we will again divide all funds 3 ways: Gasoline Work Funds, All Other Work Funds and Shelter Funds. If necessary each will be adjusted quarterly on the basis of separate indicators. If during the 1995 budget year adjustments in any of these funds were made, these will show in column C - Periodic Adjustments on RECAPITULATION SHEET (OD-FORM-5).

With this in mind, the amounts for each of these funds PER PERSON/PER YEAR in the 1996 budget for India-Madras#130 will be as follows:

Work Funds (incl. gas funds)(3D) 4.084

TOTAL 5,884 per person/per yr. (4D)

With 2 persons (8D) now assigned to your conference, total budget for 1996 will be \$\frac{11,768}{}\] (9D). This amount will change if shelter or work figures are adjusted by you (5D,6D).

We are sending 2 copies of the Budget Form (OD-FORM-5A) to the Treasurer. Fill these out as was done for the 1995 budget. Make out budget according to categories listed on the Budget Forms.

Attached to the Budget Form (and to this letter) is a RECAPITULATION SHEET. The top half has been filled in by the Overseas Department except for items 5D, 6D, 7D and 10D to be filled in if you adjust the amounts for Shelter and Work Funds. The bottom half is to be filled in as explained following: List both the 1995/1996 budgets according to the categories on the Recapitulation Sheet. Although GASOLINE FUNDS will be distributed throughout the various categories on the Budget Form according to how they are used, they are to be combined in ONE FIGURE on the Recapitulation Sheet and listed separately from "All Other WORK FUNDS."

The exchange rate used in the 1996 budget (1D) should be the rate prevailing on October 31, 1995.

The total figure per person for Work and Shelter Funds for 1996 is the POTENTIAL figure which you can receive. ACTUAL amounts received will depend on the amount of support underwritten by each unit. On the basis of what you have been receiving recently, you can arrive at a general estimate of what you will receive in your new budget.

Regarding EFICOR's advertisement, please send us the bill whenever the matter is printed in your journal so that we will make the necessary payment.

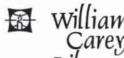

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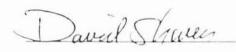

To properly allocate Mr. Page literature funds we must have a total picture of all the literature needs of all our fields for the year 1995. Each literature committee or board should plan the year's work, secure conference approval and record on these three forms the information requested. The Committee Chairman or Board Representative should keep one copy, the Conference Chairman another copy, and the third copy must reach the home office by Dec. 15. The new Institute will fill a void by providing a forum which will interest faculty and students in theological institutions and colleges, will challenge Church and mission leaders, and address complex issues in the Church's mission to South Asians today.

Migration has brought 100,000 South Asians to Los Angeles where they are accessible to the Gospel, many for the first time. Mission today is no longer geographical. It is global and multi-directional. Mission in America takes place in a local context that is primarily urban, multi-ethnic, and religiously plural. Implications bristle. These challenges are to be addressed in the new Institute.

Infrasturcture is provided by The Church on Brady, Los Angeles. Start up funds are needed for equipment, salary for research fellow, teaching materials, printing of small publications.
