Dear Colleagues:

Yes, 12 months have flown by and it is time to begin working on budgets for the next fiscal year.

During the 1996 budget year we will again divide all funds 3 ways: Gasoline Work Funds, All Other Work Funds and Shelter Funds. If necessary each will be adjusted quarterly on the basis of separate indicators. If during the 1995 budget year adjustments in any of these funds were made, these will show in column C - Periodic Adjustments on RECAPITULATION SHEET (OD-FORM-5).

With this in mind, the amounts for each of these funds PER PERSON/PER YEAR in the 1996 budget for India-Madras#130 will be as follows:

Shelter Funds (2D)	<u>1,800</u>
Work Funds (incl. gas funds)(3D)	<u>4,084</u>
TOTAL	<u>5,884</u> per person/per yr.(4D)

With 2 persons (8D) now assigned to your conference, total budget for 1996 will be \$ 11,768 (9D). This amount will change if shelter or work figures are adjusted by you (5D,6D).

We are sending 2 copies of the Budget Form (OD-FORM-5A) to the Treasurer. Fill these out as was done for the 1995 budget. Make out budget according to categories listed on the Budget Forms.

Attached to the Budget Form (and to this letter) is a RECAPITULATION SHEET. The top half has been filled in by the Overseas Department except for items 5D, 6D, 7D and 10D to be filled in if you adjust the amounts for Shelter and Work Funds. The bottom half is to be filled in as explained following: List both the 1995/1996 budgets according to the categories on the Recapitulation Sheet. Although GASOLINE FUNDS will be distributed throughout the various categories on the Budget Form according to how they are used, they are to be combined in ONE FIGURE on the Recapitulation Sheet and listed separately from "All Other WORK FUNDS."

The exchange rate used in the 1996 budget (1D) should be the rate prevailing on October 31, 1995.

The total figure per person for Work and Shelter Funds for 1996 is the POTENTIAL figure which you can receive. ACTUAL amounts received will depend on the amount of support underwritten by each unit. On the basis of what you have been receiving recently, you can arrive at a general estimate of what you will receive in your new budget.


Dear Roger,



Dear June:

I am ashamed that this letter is so late in carrying the enclosed check. The check was written on December 27 as you can see, then attached to the invoice for a letter of explanation. It got buried and I had thought I had sent it. In going through the accounting desk "stuff" I found it. So I am writing immediately to get the matter settled. I am addressing it to you as you will be better at explaining to your co-workers.

First, we eventually received all copies of *Roots of the Great Debate...* and *Evangelization and Church Growth*. However, there were quite a number damaged beyond the possibility of reselling. We believe in Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, sinless in His life, making atonement for the sin of the world by His death on the cross. We believe in His bodily resurrection, His ascension into heaven, His high priestly intercession for His people, and His personal, visible return to the world according to His promise.

We believe in the Holy Spirit who came forth from God to convince the world of sin, righteousness and of judgment, and to regenerate, sanctify and comfort those who believe in Jesus Christ.

We believe that all men by nature and by choice are sinners but that "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." We believe, therefore, that those who accept Christ as their Lord and Savior will rejoice forever in God's presence and those who refuse to accept Christ as Lord and Savior will be forever separated from God.

We believe in the Church—a living spiritual body of which Christ is the Head and of which all regenerated people are members. We believe that a visible church is a company of believers in Jesus Christ, buried with Him in baptism and associated for worship, work and fellowship. We believe that to these visible churches were committed, for observance "till He come," the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's supper; and that God has laid upon these churches the task of persuading a lost world to accept Jesus Christ as Savior and to enthrone Him as Lord and Master. We believe that human betterment and social improvement are essential products of the Gospel.

We believe that every human being is responsible to God alone in all matters of faith.

We believe that each church is independent and autonomous and must be free from interference by any ecclesiastical or political authority, that therefore Church and State must be kept separate as having different functions, each fulfilling its duties free from dictation or patronage of the other.

*I believe without mental reservation all the foregoing statements of faith and hereby
affix my name in affirmation of them.*




