Service of Dedication

LEADER: O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; fear before Him all the earth.

PEOPLE: **They that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and truth.**

LEADER: Dearly beloved, this Memorial Plaque, which by the favor of God and the labor of man has been completed, embodies the obligation of each generation to impart its treasures of wisdom and knowledge to the generations following. For the fulfillment of this task we need, not only the best that man can do, but above all, the blessing of Almighty God.

In olden times there was a custom of commemorating events and epochs in the history of the children of Israel by the setting up of stones as memorials.

The pillar at Bethel was set up by Jacob in recognition of God's presence in that place, and God's right to one-tenth of his earthly possessions.

When Joshua led the children of Israel into Canaan a man from each tribe was instructed to carry a stone from the Jordan as a memorial of their miraculous crossing.

These did Joshua pitch in Gilgal. "He spake unto the children of Israel, saying, When your children shall ask their fathers in the time to come, saying, What mean these stones? Then ye shall let your children know, saying, Israel came over this Jordan on dry land. For the Lord your God dried up the waters of Jordan before you, until ye were passed over, as the Lord your God did to the Red Sea, which he dried up from before us, until we were gone over. That all the people of the earth might know the hand of the Lord, that it is mighty: that ye might fear the Lord forever," Joshua 4:21-24.

LEADER: To the holy ministry of spreading Scriptural Holiness across these lands,

PEOPLE: **We dedicate this Memorial Plaque.**

LEADER: To the spiritual enrichment of all who come here in pursuit of holiness,

PEOPLE: **We dedicate this Memorial Plaque.**

LEADER: To those upon whose consecrated ministry depends the fruitfulness of its purpose.

PEOPLE: **We dedicate this Memorial Plaque and ourselves anew to that service of our fellow men wherein can best be performed our true service of God, in obedience to the Master when He said, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and thy neighbor as thyself." And may we serve Him in the beauty of holiness.**
