My old friend Louis:

Your father was one of the first men to tell me/backward conditions down in this great Southland. I have now finished with eleven years here at the school. We will have around 120 when we get leveled off. During that time we have put more than 50 young people into the Lord's work.

The Missionary work that your father helped start has a mebership on our various fields numbering 20,000, and on fereign soil we have schools training 200 natives for the ministry. With singers helping me I have spent 6 months in evangelistic work in the West Indies and South America, and saw 3337 souls definitely seeking God for salvation.

I am sending you a print to show what a man should look like as he is nearing his 86 birthday. The Lord has been good to me, as I suffer no pain, and sitting down I am able to go on with my class wok. I also teach a men's class on Sunday. The committee that ordained me was Geo. B Kulp, Oswald Chambers, Arthur greene. Juji Nakada, and A. E. Blann. That was in Sept. of 1906; only Ellwood Blann, out of that committee, is still living.
