Tickets on sale August 11th. to 21st, inclusive, with final limit August 24th. Dummy: with tickets, ROUND TRIP, 10 cents; without tickets, 10 cents each way. Baggage delivered from train to cottage, 20 cents each piece. Exchange your railway check for Camp Ground check, Coming, at Flovilla, and get check, Returning, at Camp Ground. Be sure and CLAIM BAGGAGE ON ARRIVAL AT THE CAMP GROUND. Have all letters addressed Flo-VILLA, GA., care Camp Ground. ENTERTAINMENT—Hotel: Rates \$1.00 a day: mea's 25 cents each; lodging 25 cents a night. Only two in room \$1.25 a day each person. Annex: room furnished with 2 cots, 2 blankets, 2 pillows, bucket, dipper, basin and lamp, \$5.00 for the 10 days; furnished cot in large room in Annex, 10 cents a night. Tents-\$5.00 and \$10.00 according to size. PASTORS of all evangelical denomination; entertained free. Apply to the President for tickets. LEADERS-For 1910, WILL H. HUFF, CHARLES M. DUNAWAY.
