



INFORMATION

Time of Meeting

The Indian Spring Holiness Camp Meeting which has grown into wonderful fame the last twenty-five years is held annually at the camp ground, opening on Thursday night before the second Sunday in August, closing the night of the third Sunday in August. This is a fixed date.

This year the opening and closing dates are August 5 to 15.

Location of Camp Ground The camp ground is a wooded and well watered tract of 85 1-2 acres in Butts county, Georgia, situated on the Indian Spring and Flovilla dummy line which touches the Southern Railroad at Flovilla, Gai, which is midway between Atlanta and Macon.

Reduced R. R. R a t e s for Georgia We have succeeded in getting a rate to the camp meeting and return at 3 cents per mile for the round trip from all points in Georgia.

All tickets will be sold to Indian Spring and all baggage will be checked to Indian Spring and the dummy line will exchange baggage checks at Flovilla and carry the baggage free to the camp ground station and return. But an additional ten cents will be charged for hauling baggage each way on camp grounds.

Rates from Other States Parties living outside the State of Georgia will have to buy tickets to Elovilla and pay 4 cents per mile round trip as heretofore.

Date of Sale R. R. Tickets

Tickets to be sold August 3rd. to 15th. to reach original starting point not later than August 19, 1915.

Several days before leaving home have your railroad agent order a supply of camp meeting tickets if he has none. Do this in plenty of time for him to write headquarters.

Handling Baggage on the Camp Ground On arrival at Flovilla, exchange railway check for camp ground check. The camp ground baggage master will meet all trains.

At dummy station, camp ground, wait and claim baggage, paying twenty cents on surrendering brass chack. This pays for transportation of baggage from Flovilla to camp ground and the delivery of baggage to cottage or hotel on the camp ground. Pay no one further charges for baggage until you start back home.

No baggage, inbound or outbound, will be handled on the camp ground on Sunday. No heavy baggage, such as trunks, will be handled by the dummy to and from the camp ground at any time unless it bears the camp ground check.

Passengers are advised to handle small baggage, such as suit cases, etc., themselves,

MAIL.—The Camp Ground postoffice is located immediately in front of the hotel. Except when trains are delayed every letter properly addresses will be delivered to party calling for it at the office within half an hour of its arrival at Flovila. Address all mail Flovilla, Ga., care Camp Ground. Stamps and stationery will be on sale at the Camp Ground postoffice during the meeting.

Registration REGISTRATION.—All persons attending the meeting are earnestly requested to register their name and address in the general registry book at the post office. This is important for several reasons: 1st. It will enable the Camp Ground postmaster to forward your mail properly, when necessary. 2nd. It will facilitate the delivery of telegrams, phone messages, special delivery letters, etc. Parties leaving the meeting should notify the postmaster.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS.—The Camp Ground Hotel will accommodate comfortably about 200 guests. Rates \$1.25 and \$1.00 a day-American plan. At the latter rates the management reserves the right to assign four guests to a room. Children under eleven, half price. Meals, 25 cents each; lodging 25 cents a night. On the two Sundays of the meeting everybody except regular guests will be charged 50 cents for dinner. No one will be considered a "guest" of the hotel unless he has spent at least a day-lodging and three meals. No lunches can be had from the hotel on Sunday. No pastors will be entertained at the hotel except at regular rates, as entertainment has been provided for them elsewhere. No "light housekeeping" can be allowed in the hotel rooms; the Annex in rear of Tabernacle was built for that.

Dodge Memorial PASTOR'S ENTERTAINMENT.—A large 16room cottage known as the Dodge Memorial is set apart for the accommodation of pastors who attend the camp meeting. It is comfortably furnished throughout. Guests of the Dodge Memorial will please note the following:

- 1. Pastors ONLY are expected.
- 2. All guests must register on arrival.
- 3. No provision is made at the Dodge Memorial for the accommodation of pastor's wives or children.

Ministerial Entertainment MINISTERIAL ENTERTAINMENT.—All ministers of any evangelical denomination, all local preachers and evangelists who are actively engaged in the ministry will have free lodging at the Parsonage near the Tabernacle and will be furnished with meal tickets at half price. Parties desiring these rates must on arrival, make application to Rev. G. W. Mathews, president, and secure an order for entertainment from him.

The Annex ANNEX.—There is just behind the Tabernacle, a new and comfortable building known as "The Annex," containing twenty rooms, 10x12 feet. each opening upon a veranda. These comfortable rooms unfurnished can be rented for the ten days of the meeting for \$5.00 each. Persons desiring one of these rooms should write Mr. F. C. Benson, Flovilla, Ga., and reserve it. Rooms will not be reserved unless money accompanies request. Cots, unfurnished, can be rented for them by writing Mr. F. C. Benson, Flovilla, Ga.

Tents

Tents of various sizes can be secured if the party furnishing them is notified in time. One, size 10x12 feet, put up and taken down without expense to occupant, can be rented for the ten days of the meeting for \$5.00. A family compartment tent with four rooms, each 7x7 fet, with hall way 7x14 feet, and with fly on either side, can be rented for \$10.00 for the same length of time. Straw will be furnished at a small additional price. These compartment tents, with two cots to the room and four to the hall way, will each accommodate twelve people. Twelve cots would cost, unfurnished, \$3.00. Parties desiring tents should write to M. D. Smith, Tent and Awning Co., 136 1-2 Marietta street, Atlanta, Ga., not later than one month before the meeting opens.

There are three fine wells and a perennial spring of the purest freestone water upon the grounds. During the meeting water from the spring is pumped into a 10,000 gallon tank on the highest part of the grounds and conveyed by pipes all over the encampment. Upon application to M. D. Simth, 136 1-2 Marietta St., Atlanta, Ga., cottages may have water connection by paying for same. There will be three free spigots on the grounds, one at the tank, one at the hotel and one at the annex. The water at the wells and at the spring is, of course, free.

SANITATION.—The trustees have put in a partial system of sewerage and expect to extend it as soon as they can secure the necessary funds. There are "Rest Cottages" for ladies conveniently located on the grounds. By the action of the Board no more surface closets can be built on the grounds, and in a short time those already buit will have to be removed. Of this the cottagers will receive notice in due time.

The rules of the encampment will be posted in conspicuous places on the grounds, and will be strictly enforced. Parties desiring copies of them to post upon their cottages can have them upon application to C. D. Tillman. By recent action of the Board of Trustees each cottage holder is required to have brick flues with walls at least four inches thick wherever stove pipe comes through the roof." The renting of

BUILDING LOTS .- Lots for building cottages are furnished without charge to parties who will agree to abide by the regulations of the trustees. These lots will be assigned in the order in which applications are filed. Parties desiring lots will write to R. F. Burden, Macon, Ga., for blank application, fill out and return to him, with remittance of \$10.00, together with name and address of two references. If the cottage is built the money will be refunded; if not, it will be converted into the Camp Ground Treasury. If a building lot is granted to any party for building purposes and the work of building is not begun by May 1, or if by that time contract has been entered into to have cottage built and building sufficiently advanced for occupancy by the ensuing camp meeting (of which the superintendent of grounds shall receive notice not later than May 1st), the lot will be forfeited; and any one having a second option on the same lot shall be at liberty to take possession upon payment of the fee of \$10.00 and signifying willingness to abide by the regulations of the Board.

Cottages for Sale By terms of the contract, no cottage-holder can dispose of his cottage without the consent of the trustees to the transfer. Parties having cottages for rent or sale will find it to their interest to confer with Mr. R. F. Burden, Macon, Ga., Chairman Executive Committee.
