ENTERTAINMENT---Hotels and boarding houses furnish ample accommodation for visitors. Board in the hotel, two in room, \$1.75 a day. More than two in room \$1.50 a day. Table board \$1.25. Single meals 50c.

ROOMS FOR RENT---Two adjoining rooms in either Annex, opening on porch on both sides, furnished with good wide spring cots, each with mattress and pillow, without bed linen and towels, \$10.00 for the ten days, in advance. One room \$5.00 Extra cots 50c each. Write F. C. Benson, Macon, Georgia.
