"THOUSANDS OF ANGELS." 1906

AND A "RADIANT CLOUD THAT WENT UP TOWARDS HEAVEN."

During a revival service at Tyrgos Farm, in the Cwmtwrch district, a collier declared that he beheld the prayer and praise of the proceedings take the form of a radiant cloud going up towards heaven.

At a Maespica gathering the now famous Mrs. Jones sat before a table in the centre of a kitchen which was crowded with men and women, some of whom hailed from Liverpool. During the service nearly all took a separate part in the singing, praying, and crying, while others fainted under the influence of excessive fervor.

In the midst of this din a man shouted, "I am ready to fight for the Lord."
This declaration caused Mrs. Jones to throw herself across the table, and apparently much moved, exclaim, thee."

Then there was great rejoicing, when a voice was heard, "I can see thousands of

angels."

The assembly was frantic with joy, laughing, praying, singing, and gesticulating being accompanied by deafening shileks and heavy blows on the table.

One man fell helpless into the arms of a woman standing by his side, and a Liverpool lady declared that she had seen Christ

in a vision.
