You can experience personal growth in your relationship with God and participate in leisure activities with your family and friends. For over a century, Indian Springs' ministries and programs have been relevant to all aspects of contemporary spiritual life.

A CONTINUING TRADITION



God has greatly blessed the work of Indian Springs. From its altars, many generations have been challenged to a deeper walk with Christ. Many have gone into full-time Christian service as pastors or missionaries. Countless others have given witness to the message of holiness in their daily lives, at home, church, school, the workplace and in all other aspects of their communities.

LOCATION

The camp ground is located at 1518 Highway 42-S, Flovilla, GA 30216, midway between Atlanta and Macon, approximately 5 miles south of Jackson and 1 mile north of Indian Springs State Park.

The camp's proximity to a state park and historical village with recreational options, shops and restaurants make its location ideal for leisure activities with family and friends.

FACILITIES

Old fashioned, nostalgic charm is part of the Indian Springs experience. The 140-acre grounds are a fascinating community of eclectic cottages of varying architectural styles, together with housing such as a century-old hotel, modern motel and youth dormitories.

The campus includes approximately 150 cottages, open air tabernacles for all ministries, Cafeteria, Hotel, "Snackateria", Bookstore, wifi access, Post Office and Business Office.

OUR HERITAGE

On December 26, 1889, four Methodist ministers knelt in a densely wooded area near Jackson, Georgia. Their hearts were deeply burdened with the commitment to establish a camp meeting to communicate the message of Scriptural holiness to local church pastors. The result was Indian Springs Holiness Camp Meeting, one of the premier holiness encampments in the United States today.

From this spiritual concept, the evangelical outreach of the camp meeting has expanded to persons in all walks of life. Each summer since 1890, this camp has faithfully proclaimed the Wesleyan Arminian tradition of Biblical holiness, as taught by John Wesley and the early Methodists.

WE BELIEVE

The Bible is the divinely inspired word of God providing authoritative quidance for every challenge and experience of life.

All are under the **penalty of sin**, but God's redemptive plan provides salvation for everyone who believes in Jesus Christ.

Sanctification is a second definite work of grace which cleanses our hearts from the **power of sin**, and continues as a process of growing more Christ-like in every day living.

The Holy Spirit provides the sanctified believer the power to grow more like Christ in his daily walk.
