Dear Brother Lockhart:

Thank you for your letter of the 24th. I am very sorry that you have had so much trouble in getting fixed like you want for camp meeting. No doubt Brother Goodwin was holding your letter in the event some one cancelled he would notify you. It is my understanding that all the rooms in the two annex's are taken.

Under separate cover I am today sending you one of our folders giving all the information about the camp. This year you can stay at the hotel for fifty cents per person per day and get meals at the hotel if you wish and if not you do not pay for them. You only pay for what you get. The rate is fifty cents for the bed; fifty cents for breakfast and eighty cents for dinner. We also have a snack bar where you can get sandwiches or drinks or milk most any time you want it.

By all means come on to Indian Springs. We will see that you are taken care of to your entire satisfaction if it is at all possible. This will be one of the big years at Indian Springs. John Church, Paul Rees and DeLong will make it so together with Milby singing. There will be great preaching and singing and we are expecting a real soul refreshing.
