Introduction

Charles Mack Todd, born in Conway, South Carolina, in 1893, was a man involved in both community and church in the Pahokee, Florida area. Todd came to Pahokee as a school teacher and a farmer and was instrumental in incorporating the City of Pahokee. He also helped to establish the Bank of Pahokee and in the paving of highway U.S. Route 441 from Miami to Belle Glade. Todd was the third mayor of Pahokee, served on the library board for 10 years, published four books, managed Pahokee's State Farmers Market for 20 years, belonged to First United Methodist Church and was a member of the Gideons. From 1919 until his death in on March 1, 1984, Todd and his wife, Luada, and their three sons, lived in Pahokee, Florida.

Following are some of the life events of Mr. Todd:

- Third mayor of Pahokee, 1926-1928
- Principal of Pahokee School
- Co-founder of Glades first packing house - Unity Farms
- Manager of Pahokee State Farmers Market, for twenty years
- Farmer
- Insurance salesman
- Co-founder of First United Methodist Church in Pahokee
- Adult Sunday School teacher, for 17 years
- Chaplain in State Prison, for 6 years

He also published four books, one of which is a history of Pahokee.

The Charles Mack Todd collection consists of two boxes. Box 1 contains three publications: Echoes, Atomic Energy Plus, and Our Lord's Prayer. Additionally, it also contains four manuscripts: "On Earth and in Heaven," "Going Steady," "The Great Controversial Missionary, Saulus-Paulus," and "The Great Controversial Missionary Part II."
