ATTENDANCE

 - Unexcused absences include discretionary or optional trips and events.
 - If such a student does not submit a written explanation, each absence over two will result a final grade deduction of one grade increment.

1. NT501-502 Comprehensive Greek is a prerequisite for upper level Greek exegesis courses and intermediate Greek.
