The letter came to here

and was presented at our Monthly
Meeting today. There was a unanimous
voted approval of receiving H. C. &
dear daughter and a great many
expressed their joy at having her
a member of our Meeting and of
the need there was for just such
teachers and the value of the service
when J. P. Evans arose and raised
the question of the views on Eternal
punishment. When my husband
read the letter and we both
gave explanations in regard

to it but as there seemed to be
a feeling that the expression
of thy views was not quite
definite enough a Committee
was appointed to correspond with
the on the matter and have
what thy views were upon final
restitution. P Evans was on this
Committee. He is D Bk's warm
friend and was very much
annoyed at the position thou
took in regard to baptism of the
Holy Ghost & Sanctification and
I fear may give the trouble of
Thou art not very wise.

Every body in the meeting wants
you, and are so anxious to have
thee a Member. There is open
up before thee a wonderful
field for usefulness in our
Society. There is not a single
teacher in our Society, we
have Evangelists and exhorters

but no women teachers of the
way of life and salvation, and
not so much need them, and
then there are all over this
Gt My women who used to be
fully saved so that they would
give their tongues to the Lord are
their talents to him in the line
of the ministry

And now my dear sister there
is a way out of this matter
somehow. The doctrine of final
restitution is not important
to salvation and should not
stand in thy way of doing the
work which is now before
thee and of being in the way
of thy ministry and the salvation
of souls. There is no one that
could do the work which thou
can in our Society, but we
have got to get that one out
of the way. I leave from thy

thy letter that thou hast made
up thy mind to drop the subj,
and I was so glad of it, and
I do trust the dear Lord will
enable thee to give that whole
matter over to him. I noticed
that thou said that thou was
a thorough "Speaker" and may
I suggest- that in response to
the letter which will be written
to thee by the lawyer written by the
Chairman who is my husband
that instead of going into an
explanation of what thy views
in its various shades are on
the question, that thou take
thy stand on George Fox's Epistle
to the Governor of Barbadoes
in 1681. I know thou can do
that. and if thou just refer
them to that Epistle as the
exposition of thy views, without

Any further explanation as to what
in the counsels and wisdom of
God may be done millions of
years hence. It will satisfy
every one and there can be
placed at once in a position
where the Church so much
needs the

The whole thing hangs on the
word eternal, we all agree it
will be a long time and we
are entitled to private thoughts
and investigation but unless
we could settle the matter
more definitely than we can
it is far wiser for us to not do
anything that will mar our
usefulness or close the doors
for service when so many souls
are ready to be saved. There
are I admit persons in the body
and ministers who are not at
present but that sometime in his
counsel all things will be brought

into subjection to Christ like as
there are so many weak persons
in the Church it is not best to
bring this idea out, Then believe
in a hell and eternal punish-
ment as far as that word ~~can~~
goes with its real meaning (what
ever that is,) implies

Excuse me for this trouble
for I am so anxious to have
you with us and I know there
is one with us in the family
on which we stand and then
is no use in letting this doubt be
