Dear Friend -

Yesterday at the Muscatine Local W. C. I. U. allusion was made to my prospect of leaving America for awhile on account of poor health. Sympathy was expressed and thankful appreciation of my unrewarded and very valuable labors as National Superintendent of Evangelistic work for the W. C. I. U.

The Secretary of the Union was directed to record a minute expressive of the love and sympathy of this Union and I was instructed to write an expression thereof to thee.

Not alone in the hearts of the women of the W. C. I. U. but in many Christian homes

is thy name and thy writings precious.
Prayers ascend from many hearts that the
blessing of the Lord may continue to abide richly
on thee and thine and that thy life may
long be spared to bless others -

Last fall my dear sister Phoebe C. Johnson who
met thee at New England S. Mtg., last Oct. Mo.
wrote thee requesting that thou send thy Bible
Leaflets to her - they came promptly and I
can not sufficiently thank thee for sending
them - They have been a great blessing to me
and others. Each week Christian women meet
in our room and we are greatly instructed
and benefitted in studying thy Bible readings.
I also use them in house to house visitation
among mothers who can not leave their homes
to attend the Bible readings -

Perry, Woodbury Co. Iowa, spent some time
with us in evangelistic work last winter
and was very anxious to have them to use in
her present home but I have not yet felt
that I can spare what I have.

I hope thou will be able to furnish a Bible
Lesson for publication each month.
