A SPECIAL MESSAGE OF GREAT IMPORTANCE

Dear Friend of Indian Springs:

To meet the challenging need a fuller ministry to our Indian Springs young people the Board of Trustees at the Annual Meeting approved the building of a Boys Dormitory and a Girls Dormitory. This matter was presented to the camp at the last Saturday Night Service stating that we did not wish to go in debt and that this project would not be started until the money was available.

By providing adequate dormitory facilities we will be able to accommodate those young people who desire to attend camp, but do not have families or friends with cottages on the grounds. Those staying in the dormitories would be under the supervision of older persons interested in their welfare and spiritual needs. This alone will fill a most vital phase in our young people's program.

That great Saturday night congregation was so in accord with the need that \$5000 was received in pledges and cash. We now have some \$3500 in pledges and \$1800 in a savings account. If the Saturday night crowd would do this, we felt that if the entire list of friends of the camp was contacted maybe three times this amount would come this year. This would enable us to put up one building for the 1959 camp and another building the next year.

Will you prayerfully consider this need before God. This will be an investment for souls for eternity. Please mail your check or pledge to the Treasurer, Mr. C. S. Newton, Homerville, Ga. These funds will be held in a special dormitory savings account until the amount is sufficient to proceed.
